

The California Education Code (Section 44355) requires all candidates for a teaching credential to demonstrate knowledge about the United States Constitution. This requirement must be completed before the credential can be granted. The U.S. Constitution requirement can be met by satisfactory completion of one of the following:

- Complete an approved college-level course at a regionally accredited community college or university. Please provide us a copy of an official transcript and a copy of the course description.

OR

- Pass an approved college level examination at a regionally accredited college or university. Below is a list of institutions that offer the U.S. Constitution exam:

The exam costs \$85, consists of 50 multiple-choice questions, and is timed. Your score calculated immediately and a personalized Certificate of Passing can be printed at the time of completion.
